### From Your Board Chair

It is my extreme privilege to report to you on the banner year your Foundation experienced in 2024. We achieved record-level total assets of \$41.4 million, received contributions totaling \$7.1 million, and awarded \$5.9 million in grants and scholarships to our communities. Beyond financial growth, our board and staff have made internal improvements to strengthen our capacity and culture, ensuring we can serve Lenawee County even more effectively in the years ahead.

One of the year's biggest milestones was the successful completion of our Health, Happiness, and Hope Fund campaign, dedicated to building a set of local resources to meet our community's ever-changing needs. We now have more than \$2 million in cash and pledges and we are deeply grateful to the donors who made this possible.

Our long-term investment portfolio also delivered strong results for a second consecutive year. Following 2023's 17.8% annual return, we experienced a 13.08% return in 2024. Our 5-year average annual return stands at 7.91%, and the 10-year average return at 7.32%, all exceeding their industry benchmarks.

Your CEO has provided outstanding leadership to both the staff and your Board of Directors. Many significant improvements in internal processes, controls, and procedures have been made, ensuring your Foundation remains strong for the future. Key accomplishments include establishing and funding an operating reserve covering six months of operating costs, and the creation of a capital reserve fund to maintain our physical facility and equipment. A priority for 2025 is a new grant-making policy to provide clearer guidance for nonprofits and community initiatives seeking support.

A major highlight of 2024 was receiving a \$10 million grant from the MEDC to support the new Workforce Development Center on Adrian's east side. The first installment of funding was received in February, and we have worked closely with Align Center throughout the year. We are excited for the building's scheduled completion by mid-summer 2025, bringing vital workforce training opportunities to our community.

To better represent all of Lenawee County, our Board Governance Committee has been focused on expanding and diversifying our leadership. We now have board members from Adrian, Blissfield, Clinton, Hudson, Manitou Beach, Morenci, Onsted, and Tecumseh, ensuring a broad and inclusive perspective. It is an honor to serve alongside such dedicated board members and a generous community committed to making Lenawee County stronger.

And nearly \$6 million was granted back into Lenawee County last year—not money raised, but money going out into the community. These grants supported mental health programs, helped feed families, strengthened nonprofits, empowered youth, and so much more.

Every grant, every scholarship, and every fund is a reflection of someone who said, "Yes, I want to make a difference." Behind every number is a story. And behind every story is a generous person or partner like you. Your support brings hope, health, and opportunity to life in Lenawee. Thank you for believing in what's possible when we work together. On behalf of our staff and board of directors, and everyone whose life has been touched by your generosity, thank you for your continued partnership.

Together, we're building a healthier, happier, and more hopeful Lenawee—now and for generations to come.




### FUND VALUES BY FUND TYPE


### Incito

### YOUTH LEADERS

The Lenawee YOUTH Council (LYC), the Lenawee Community Foundation's Youth Advisory Committee (YAC), is a passionate group of middle and high school students from across the county who are making a real difference in the lives of their peers. Entrusted with the responsibility of reviewing and recommending grants that support youth-focused programs, LYC members serve as both grantmakers and community advocates.

Meeting twice a month, the Council balances philanthropy with hands-on experience. Their time together includes volunteer work, community service projects, college visits, career exploration, and deep discussions about local needs and the power of giving. Each member brings a unique perspective, strengthening the Council's impact and building their skills as leaders.

The YAC program began in 1991 through a challenge grant from the Michigan Community Foundation Youth Project, funded by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. Its mission remains strong: to empower young people, engage them in their communities, and teach the values of philanthropy, leadership, and service.



In 2024, LYC members volunteered at organizations including Adrian District Library, Migrant Resource Council, LUX Closet, Ahimsa Safe Haven, 517 Day, a park cleanup at The Pit, and much more. They also supported key initiatives of the Lenawee Community Foundation, including the Imagination Library.

The Lenawee Community Foundation is proud to support these remarkable young people, whose dedication, compassion, and thoughtful leadership are building a brighter future for Lenawee County.

### "Children are the world's most valuable resource and its best hope for the future."













The Lenawee Imagination Library is building a brighter future—one book at a time. In 2024, over 12,400 books were delivered to children from birth to age five across Lenawee County. Each month, enrolled children receive a free, brand-new, age-appropriate book by mail to treasure and keep. The Lenawee Community Foundation proudly partners with Dolly Parton's

Imagination Library to place books into the hands of young children in our community. From 2010-2024, 240,862 books have been mailed to more than 8,000 Lenawee County children.

Early literacy is vital. Nearly 50% of Lenawee's children start school without necessary reading skills. That's where the Lenawee Imagination Library makes a difference. The annual cost per child to provide this service is just \$31—a small investment that fosters language skills, imagination, and a lifelong love of reading. Thanks



to generous support from local civic clubs, individuals, businesses, and foundations, the program is completely free to families, ensuring every child has the chance to grow up with books.

Hunters Helping Lenawee, established in 2010, is committed to fighting hunger by providing local food pantries and meal programs with nutritious venison. In 2024 alone, the program delivered an impressive 5,185 pounds of venison, enough to provide nearly 21,000 meals to individuals and families across Lenawee County.

Since its founding, Hunters Helping Lenawee has helped supply over 80,000 meals, offering a critical source of protein to those in need. This impact wouldn't be possible

without the generous hunters who donate their deer and the dedicated processors who prepare meat: the Kasper's Hickory House, Palmer's Deer Processing, and Exact Wildlife Creations. also deeply We're grateful to the donors who fund the processing costs, ensuring this vital program continues to nourish our community.





**VOLUNTEER Lenawee!** continues to be a vital connector between people who want to serve and the organizations that need them. With generous support from the George W. Romney Fund for Volunteerism, the Michigan Nonprofit Association, and individual donors, the program thrives as a hub for local engagement and community impact.



An endowment fund, quite simply, is money set aside (invested) to earn revenue to fund some type of charitable activity. Unlike a typical investment fund, the beneficiary of an endowment fund is a nonprofit organization or charitable cause instead of individual investors. The principal value of the endowment fund is kept intact, while the investment earnings can be distributable dollars used for charitable grants to nonprofits. Thus, an endowment fund can be held permanently, allowing donors to support causes they care about in perpetuity.

### Permanent Guardianship of Gifts

A gift to the Foundation may establish, or be added to, an endowment fund. Endowment funds are structured to serve their charitable purpose(s) in perpetuity. The amount available for distribution is carefully established by the Foundation to ensure the preservation and long-term growth of each endowment fund. Donors appreciate knowing that their contributions will extend beyond their lifetimes and will be carefully safeguarded to serve the community as originally intended.

### Choice of Charitable Beneficiaries

Donors are able to realize most charitable intents by designating the organizations or the philanthropic purposes to be served by their fund. Through the Foundation, donors have the freedom to structure funds to accomplish their charitable objectives.

### Economies of Scale

We strive to offer a better investment return to each participating fund within the Foundation through: (1) the pooling of assets, (2) the diversification of investments and (3) the reduction of costs to any one fund through shared expenses.

### Recognition

Funds may be established in the name of the donor, the donor's family, a friend, a business, a charitable purpose, or another organization. Those establishing endowment funds are guaranteed perpetual recognition through publications and through the annual distributions of grants in the name of the fund. Conversely, the Foundation understands and respects a donor's wish for anonymity and will administer such gifts accordingly.

### Flexibility

The Foundation carefully adheres to the terms of all gifts entrusted to its care. If the original purposes of a fund become obsolete or incapable of fulfillment, the Foundation has the responsibility to redirect the fund to other related purposes. That power is used sparingly, and donors may rest assured that the spirit of their charitable objectives will be represented in perpetuity.

### Accountability

Annual reviews through board oversight, filing of tax returns, public disclosure of all grant activity, and careful selection of board members ensure continued use of funds in the public interest.

### Foundation within a Foundation

Affiliation with the Foundation offers the advantages of a private foundation without the attendant expense and time commitment. We relieve donors of the complications of administering their own foundations by assuming full responsibility for the efficient, prudent management of each fund entrusted to our care.


### Maximum Tax Deductibility

The Community Foundation is classified as a public charity under Section 501(c)(3) and Section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Internal Revenue Code. This status affords donors tax deductions for income and estate tax purposes to the maximum extent permissible under current tax law.

### A RECORD YEAR

### OF FEEDING OUR COMMUNITY



n Lenawee County, hometown pride runs deep, and so does our commitment to taking care of one another. Through the generosity of local hunters, processors, volunteers, and donors, Hunters Helping Lenawee had a record-breaking year of putting healthy meals on local tables.

By December 20, 2024, the program had already reached 3,575 pounds of donated venison—a milestone that reflected both the momentum of the season and the community's deep care for neighbors in need. Just weeks later, as hunting season came to a close, donations soared to a record-breaking 5,185 pounds, providing nearly 21,000 nutritious meals across Lenawee County.

Since launching in 2010, Hunters Helping Lenawee has provided over 80,000 meals, helping to fight hunger with lean, quality protein sourced right here in our community. With one in six people in Lenawee relying on food assistance, the impact of this homegrown program is both urgent and lasting. Every pound of venison feeds at least four people, and every donation helps make Lenawee a stronger, healthier place for all.

"Hunters Helping Lenawee is one of the ways the Lenawee

Community Foundation connects people who care with causes that matter," said Bronna Kahle, LCF President and CEO. "We're grateful for the hunters who donate deer, and also for the local processors, food pantries, meal programs, volunteers, and donors who make this program possible. Providing nutritious meals to local families, individuals, and seniors in need, helps to build a healthier, stronger Lenawee, now and forever."

Hunters Helping Lenawee began in 2010 with initial funding from individual donors and grants from local foundations, including the Lenawee Community Foundation, along with funds received from a grant.

Financial gifts to the program help cover processing fees so even more healthy meals can be distributed throughout Lenawee County. Whether in the field or around the dinner table, Hunters Helping Lenawee continues to bring people together—for the Love of Lenawee.





# Family in Crisis

### **A Community That Cares.**

When life takes an unexpected turn, it's the strength of our community that helps carry us forward. Thanks to a grant from the Lenawee Community Foundation, one young family found the support they needed during a health crisis, and the hope to keep going.

Kaitlin Avila, a proud Sand Creek graduate and current custodian at Sand Creek Community Schools, was overjoyed to be expecting her first child. But about seven months into her pregnancy, her health took a sudden turn. She began experiencing seizures, which forced her to take a leave of absence from work. Not long after, she was induced early, and baby

Audrey was delivered and transferred to the Mott NICU in Ann Arbor.

The situation placed an emotional and financial strain on Kaitlin and her husband Carlos. As they traveled back and forth to Ann Arbor while managing Kaitlin's recovery and caring for a premature newborn, basic needs became a growing concern.

That's when the Foundation's grant made all the difference. Through its support of Sand Creek Community Schools, the grant helped fund a Basic Needs Pantry that provides clothing, hygiene products, and crisis assistance for students and families. More importantly, it allowed the district to step in and provide direct relief to the Avila family.

"As a first-time mom, facing these challenges was initially very intimidating," Kaitlin shared. "Being honored with this

> grant by my Sand Creek family was a blessing beyond description. My family is so grateful for the support and never could have imagined the outpouring of help and encouragement! Thank you to all involved for making this possible!"

Rachel Myers, Director of the Aggie Academic Career Counseling Center, reflected on the broader significance of this support:

"The work that the Lenawee Community Foundation does is an invaluable resource in these difficult times."

The Lenawee Community Foundation provides the means for individual community members, businesses, and organizations to come together to fund urgent, real-world solutions that address the most fundamental needs in our county - needs like food, shelter, and crisis assistance. But beyond that, they provide the building blocks for something deeper: health for families, happiness in moments of fear, and the kind of hope that lasts long after the crisis has passed.

The Lenawee Community Foundation's investment objective is to preserve or grow the real (inflation-adjusted) purchasing power of its assets, while generating a stable and predictable payout stream that supports charitable distributions over the long term. To achieve this, the Foundation's long-term investment portfolio is strategically allocated with 70% in equities and 30% in fixed income. The chart below illustrates the composition of this long-term portfolio.





The Lenawee Community Foundation is a nonprofit corporation exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The financial statements are prepared on an accrual basis of accounting. Under this method, revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recognized when incurred.
